RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

1. All entries should be on the official entry forms supplied with the Schedule. You may download

or print extra Schedules & forms from our website www.stalhamhorticultural.uk

2. Please read the specific requirements of the classes that you are entering carefully.

3. When completed, the entry forms can be put into the special boxes which can be found at the

4. All entry forms, whether sent by email or box collection must be submitted by 12 noon on the Thursday before the show. The boxes are available for entries 9 days before the show date. The boxes will be gathered soon after 12 noon & thereafter no further entries can be accepted.

5. Exhibits can be staged at the Poppy Centre, Recreation Road, Stalham NR12 9BH either on the

Friday between 5.30pm & 6.30pm or Saturday between 8.00am & 10.45am

There will always be people on hand to help and support you and to give advice.

6. Exhibitors are to use the plastic vases (there are small, medium and large sizes) and the paper plates, provided for free by the Society, whenever possible.

7. You will be given a name card to display at each of your exhibits. All cards will be turned over

by Stewards before judging commences at 11.00am.

8. An Exhibitor may stage only one entry per class, in all classes.

9. The Stewards reserve the right to move exhibits to accommodate others or to make more room.
10. Pots and greenhouse items to be shown, should have been in the entrant's possession for no less than three months. Flowers, soft fruit and vegetables being shown in the various classes are to be grown in the exhibitors' own gardens.

11. Judging commences at 11am. After judging the exhibitors are to leave their show cards on the benches with their exhibit, so that visitors know by whom the entries have been submitted.

12. Please remove your exhibits and Show cards after the presentation of the awards and Raffle on the Show Day (Approximately 4pm)

13. Cookery

- Please note that judges may sample or cut all cookery items. Any items containing meat, fish or cream, must be exhibited on an ice tray, which is to be provided by the exhibitor. All baked items must be covered by cling film or a clear bag for hygiene purposes.

14. Pot Plants

- All pot plants must be exhibited on a saucer. Please note that the maximum pot size is 12" (30cm). Except where specified. Measurement is taken across the inside top of the pot.

15. Disputes

- If an entrant disagrees with a judge's decision, then please see someone, so that the matter may be resolved. We do use accredited judges. Please remember, that the judges are impartial & have no prior knowledge of an entrant's details when deciding placements.

Dahlia Classification for help with Dahlia identification

<u>Cactus</u> dahlias have fully double blooms, the ray florets are usually pointed, the majority narrow & revolute* for 65% or more of their length & either straight or incurving.



Decorative dahlias have fully double blooms showing no disc. The ray florets are generally broad & flat, or slightly twisted & usually bluntly pointed, & may be involute* for no more than 75% of their length.



Ball dahlias have fully double blooms, ball shaped or slightly flattened. The ray florets are blunt or rounded at the tips, spirally arranged, with margins involute* for at least 75% of the length of the florets.



Pompon dahlias have fully double, spherical blooms with florets involute* for the whole of their length



Single flowered dahlias have blooms with a single outer ring of florets, which may overlap, the centre forming a disc.



<u>**Collarette**</u> dahlias have blooms with a single outer ring of generally flat ray florets, which may overlap, with a ring of small florets (the collar), the centre forming a disc.



Anemone dahlias have blooms with one or more outer rings of generally flattened ray florets surrounding a dense group of tubular florets, which are longer than the disc florets in Single dahlias, and showing no disc



Waterlily dahlias have fully double blooms characterised by broad ray florets, which are straight or slightly involute along their length, giving the flower a saucer shaped appearance. The depth should be no more than one third of diameter of the bloom

* **Involute** = Petals curl inwards towards the centre of the flower & upwards, towards the sky.

* **Revolute =** Petals curl outwards down their length away from the centre of the flower & curl downwards towards the ground.

Apple Cake Recipe for category Number 86.

(225g) Self Raising Flour
1 rounded teaspoon of baking powder
1 level teaspoon mixed spice
Half level teaspoon of Ground Cinnamon
3 Bramley apples, approximately (550g)
175g light brown soft sugar
75g of spreadable butter
2 large eggs, beaten
A teaspoon of milk if needed
lcing Sugar for dusting (optional)

Grease and line the base of a 20cm cake tin. Heat the oven to 180°c /160°c fan /gas 4 Sift the flour, Baking powder, and Spices together into a roomy mixing bowl.

Chop the apples into small dices, with or without the peel. Place the apples into a bowl and toss them with 1 tablespoon of the flour mixture.

Combine the eggs butter and sugar with the rest of the flour and whisk with an electric whisk for about 1 minute until smooth and creamy. Then fold in the apples until well distributed. If the mixture seems a little dry add a tablespoon of milk.

Spoon into prepared tin and level. Bake in the centre of the oven for about 1 hour until it feels springy and shows signs of shrinking away from the edge of the tin.

Allow to cool for 10 minutes in the tin, then lift onto a rack to cool completely. Dust with icing sugar if you wish.
