Paul discussed the effect of climate change & the changes in the length of the season & reflected on microclimates across the UK. The origins of the cauliflower & the fact that cauliflower is available all through the year from different regions of the British Isles.

Who knew a wallflower was part of the brassica family!

All that was involved in plant breeding was discussed. Growing problems, diseases, & fungicides no longer available.

Clubroot & it's spread a major problem (single celled amoeba), worldwide. Finally, did you know the bottom of a cauliflower is made up of 5 florets?
