### RULES AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY – PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

- **1.** All entries should be on the official entry forms supplied with the Schedule. You may download or print extra Schedules & forms from our website **www.stalhamhorticultural.uk**
- 2. Please read the specific requirements of the classes that you are entering carefully.
- **3.** When completed, the entry forms can be put into the special boxes which can be found at the **Post Office** in Stalham. **Sutton Hardware & Garden Centre**, The Street, Sutton NR12 9RA & **A G Meale & Sons** Wayford NR12 9LJ.

- **4.** All entry forms, whether sent by email or box collection must be submitted by 12 noon on the Thursday before the show. The boxes are available for entries 9 days before the show date. The boxes will be gathered soon after 12 noon & thereafter no further entries can be accepted.
- 5. Exhibits can be staged at the Poppy Centre, Recreation Road, Stalham NR12 9BH either on the

### Friday between 5.30pm & 6.30pm or Saturday between 8.00am & 10.45am There will always be people on hand to help and support you and to give advice.

- **6.** Exhibitors are to use the plastic vases (there are small, medium and large sizes) and the paper plates, provided for free by the Society, whenever possible.
- **7.** You will be given a name card to display at each of your exhibits. All cards will be turned over by Stewards before **judging commences at 11.00am**.
- 8. An Exhibitor may stage only one entry per class, in all classes. **Group/Family collaboration is allowed & positively encouraged** but again, you may only exhibit one entry per class.
- 9. The Stewards reserve the right to move exhibits to accommodate others or to make more room.
- **10.** Pots and greenhouse items to be shown, should have been in the entrant's possession for no less than three months. Flowers, soft fruit and vegetables being shown in the various classes are to be grown in the exhibitors' own gardens.
- **11.** Judging commences at 11am. After judging the exhibitors are to leave their show cards on the benches with their exhibit, so that visitors know by whom the entries have been submitted.
- **12.** Please remove your exhibits and Show cards after the presentation of the awards and Raffle on the Show Day (Approximately 4pm)

### 13. Cookery

- Please note that judges may sample or cut all cookery items. Any items containing meat, fish or cream, must be exhibited on an ice tray, which is to be provided by the exhibitor. All baked items must be covered by cling film or a clear bag for hygiene purposes.

### 14. Pot Plants

- All pot plants must be exhibited on a saucer. Please note that the maximum pot size is 12" (30cm). Except where specified. Measurement is taken across the inside top of the pot.

### 15. Disputes

- If an entrant disagrees with a judge's decision, then please see someone, so that the matter may be resolved. We do use accredited judges. Please remember, that the judges are impartial & have no prior knowledge of an entrant's details when deciding placements.

- 27. Vase of Tulips Mixed Cultivars..... 3 Stems
- 28. Vase of Mixed Spring Flowers, arranged for effect (includes Hellebores)
- 29. Vase of Mixed Flowering Shrubs or Trees, arranged for effect
- **30.** 9 x Hellebore heads displayed on a Board or any flat surface = 9" x 9" (23cm x 23cm)
- **31.** Vase of Hyacinth .....3 Stems
- 32. Vase of Muscari .....5 stems
- 33. Vase of mixed foliage arranged for effect

### **Daffodil Classification List - for your information**

### Division 1: Trumpet



One flower per stem; longer corona (ie trumpet) at least as long as the perianth segments (petals).

### Division 7: Jonquilla & Apodanthus



Usually 1 to 5 (more rarely up to 8) flowers per stem. Perianth segments reflexed or spreading. Corona is cup or funnel shaped or flared, usually wider than long. Usually fragrant.

### Division 2: Large Cupped



One flower per stem; shorter corona (ie cup) is more than 1/3, but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments (petals).

### Division 8: Tazetta



3 to 20 flowers per stem. Perianth segments spreading (not reflexed) and usually fragrant.

### Division 3: Small Cupped



One flower per stem; corona (cup) not more than 1/3 of the length of the perianth segments (petals).

### Division 9: Poeticus



Usually one flower per stem. Perianth segments white. Corona very short or disc shaped, usually with a green/yellow centre and red rim, but sometimes of a single colour. Usually fragrant.

### Division 4: Double



One or more flowers per stem; double the number of perianth segments or the corona, or both.

### Division 10: Bulbicodium



Usually one flower per stem. Perianth segments insignificant compared to the corona. Anthers dorsifixed (ie attached central to filament). Filament style curved.

### **Division 5: Triandrus**



Usually two or more pendant flowers per stem, perianth segments often reflexed.

Division 11: Split Corona



Corona (cup or trumpet) is split, usually for more than ½ its length. Either with the corona segments opposite the perianth segments, usually in 2 whorls of 3 (type A), or with the corona segments alternate to the perianth segments, usually in a single whorl of 6 (type B).

### Division 6: Cyclamineus



One flower per stem; perianth segments prominently reflexed. Flower at an acute angle to the stem with a very short pedicel.

Division 12: Other

This is for the the "miscellaneous" cultivars which do not fit the other classifications.

Division 13: Other

This classification is for the cultivars distinguished solely by botanical name.

Not more than 12" (30cm) pots (across the inside top of the pot). Except where specified.

- 47. 3 Alpine or Rock plants in 1 container
- 48. 1 Sedum or Saxifragaceae
- 49. A trough, pan or bowl of mixed Alpines or Rock plants, arranged for effect.

Pan/bowl not to exceed 18"(46cm) diameter. Trough not to exceed 18"(46cm) length or 9"(23cm) width

### Recipe for making Banana Loaf - Category No 68

### Ingredients:

113g (4oz) butter - softened, plus extra for the tin 170g (6oz) caster sugar 2 large eggs - beaten 225g (8oz) self-raising flour – sifted with 1 level teaspoon baking powder 2 very ripe bananas - mashed

### Instructions:

### step 1

Heat oven to 180C or 160C for fan oven or gas 4. Butter a 2 lb (900g) loaf tin and line the base and sides with non-stick baking parchment.

### step 2

Cream softened butter and caster sugar until light and fluffy, then slowly add the 2 beaten large eggs with a little of the flour.

### step 3

Fold in the remaining flour, the 1 tsp baking powder and the 2 mashed bananas.

### step 4

Pour the mixture into the prepared tin and bake for about 55 mins, or until cooked through.

The time may vary depending on the shape of your loaf tin. So, check the loaf at 5-minute intervals in the oven from around 45-50 mins by testing it with a skewer (it should be able to be inserted and removed cleanly).

### step 5

Cool in the tin for 10 mins, then remove to a wire rack to cool completely.
